Report of Policy Committee pursuant to Article 5 Section 3 CBL 2016

- 1. After Montgomery 2015, I completed my work on the first draft of the Policy Manual for NTCA, pursuant to Article 3, Section 7 of CBL. I coordinated with The Club President and the Chair of the Bylaws Committee;
- In or around December 2015, I completed a draft document and submitted it to the President for submission to the Board of Directors (BOD) for approval. The Policy Manual cannot be posted to the Club website nor distributed among members until It has been approved by the BOD;
- 3. In the ensuing period the Bylaws committee has a new draft of the 2016 Constitution and Bylaws for the NTCA (CBL). That draft has been circulated among members and comments have been received by the Chair;
- 4. The decision was made that version 1 of the Policy Manual will be a compilation of existing policy only (policy that is documented in BOD meeting minutes, membership meeting minutes, board approved committee job description and NTCA forms). This will be presented to the BOD at their Oct. meeting for approval.
- 5. I have prepared 2 new proposed policies for BOD approval and insertion into the Policy Manual: (1) Arbitration and (2) Member Travel Reimbursement.
- 6. I fully expect that early in 2017 the new Policy Manual should be available on our website.

The NTUAS fundraising campaign donation total through September 15, 2016 is \$41,438.00, which is 82% of our goal of \$50,000. There is \$8,562.00 remaining to fund.

After Fundraising Campaign Kit mailing to our club members in February, we have seen a slow but steady influx of NTUAS funds to the CHF, NTCA and Generosity.com portals, by non-members as well as a proportion of our members.

In addition, we have received generous donations from all three regional clubs:

- Lonestar Norwich Terrier Club \$5000
- Norwich Terrier Club of Greater Chicago \$1000
- Norwich Terrier Club of Northern California \$1000

Amanda Kozora hosted a walk in Texas in the beginning of the summer and was able to collect and contribute funds from walkers, sponsors, an auction item and matching funds from her employer. To date no other member has expressed interesting in hosting a walk in their communities. Amelia Smith is trying to organize and get approval for a walk at her school.

The Specialities have had representation, support collateral material on display and a consistent presence throughout the year for the show community audience. Generally people take material, yet donations are not collected.

The Facebook page created for the drive is updated weekly with study and funding news and serves as a go-to for current information on all aspects including donation links.

The new website has a featured section for the campaign funding and is kept current and consistent with the FB page, thanks to Amanda Koroza.

*Generosity.com* has proven to be a means of spontaneous donations fueled by emails that specifically ask our members to make a donation. There have been two donation surges since the start of the campaign, totaling: \$1825.00. The ease of sharing this portal through social media and email lists as well as it's user friendly and dynamic presentation, gives the NTUAS cause an online presence and accessibility that aligns with the campaign. My hope is that people have taken the time to share this with all potential donors on their email list but we have no means of tracking that activity.

The bi-monthly eBay auctions have been hugely successful both in the quality and quantity of donations that have been submitted for the sale, as well as in the bidding. We have added the regional club presidents to our email list and asked that they forward our sale launches onto their members. Judy Laffey has also directed these emails to an international Norwich contact list. We completed our 11<sup>th</sup> auction and have confirmed items to sell through November.

In August, we launched the Hunting Horn Norwich Enameled Necklace Raffle to all members. Kathy Norris, owner of HH Jewelers, willingly sent an email to her customer base and donated the necklace and pendant at a value of \$ 350. Tickets costs are: 1/\$5, 10/\$40, 20/\$75. Nicky Conroy is collecting

tickets via mail until September 15<sup>th</sup> and at the Montgomery Weekend. To date we have received \$665 and 14 people have mailed in stubs. The committee will continue to sell tickets that weekend. The drawing will be on October 8th at the member's meeting. I designed the sell sheet and tickets as an emailable pdf to save the cost of printing and mailing raffle tickets. A small portion of printed sell sheets and raffle forms were mailed to our non-email members.

**Fast fact:** If every member purchased one sheet of raffle tickets for \$40, by October 8<sup>th</sup> we would raise an additional \$11,120 and have surpassed the goal.

Also in August, a personalized letter was mailed to <u>all breeders who had not yet contributed to the</u> <u>campaign with a donation</u>. An anonymous board member offered to donate \$500 if 90% of breeders had donated (that's meant 38 <u>new</u> donors from the NTCA Breeder's Directory) by September 15<sup>th</sup>. To date, we have only 3 new breeder donors so we will not meet this challenge but may consider asking for an extension date. We are very disappointed with this turnout especially since <u>any</u> donation amount would have been counted towards participation.

After Montgomery weekend, I will be sending an email out to all breeders to encourage them to reach out to puppy owners. Judy Laffey has written a template letter that they can used to explain the study and goals. It's as easy as cutting and pasting this letter into a fresh email. We hope that it will make it easy for those that may have been intimidated to write their own letter or could not find the time to do it themselves.

We have 150 black and white prints of three Norwich with hay bale and pumpkins from artist Janet L. Wissmann, which are not being used and can be turned into revenue. Judy and I have selected a very inexpensive frame and we will be setting up a sales platform on eBay to move all prints as well as taking orders at Montgomery. All proceeds will go to NTUAS.

At the Montgomery dinner, Judy Laffey will be staging a small silent auction with all proceeds dedicated to NTUAS. Additionally, she is using \$500 that her husband donated to purchase 32 ceramic treat jars with the NTUAS dog mascot printed on the side. Cost is \$14.95 each. If we sell them at the dinner for \$25 each, we will make an additional \$300 for a total of \$800.

At Montgomery, we will be kicking off a second raffle that will run through the year. The prize, a limited-edition bronze sculpture of two running Norwich mounted on a stone base by acclaimed artist Leslie Hutto, donated from the estate of Sandra Johnson. It is a gorgeous piece and we hope that it will bring the fundraiser to a successful and exciting close. This item will be showcased at Montgomery club gatherings and will run to the end of 2016. Drawing date and location to be determined.

In conclusion, I remain optimistic that we can succeed in reaching our goal by year end. We absolutely need to keep the momentum up and add some pressure through December, leverage the direct contact we will have with so many members at Montgomery weekend and enlist the board in helping us to drive home the importance of active participation in the remaining four months of this campaign, especially with our breeder group.

I have been blessed with three outstanding committee members who work tirelessly, intelligently and selfishly to support this goal, the vision and the future of the breed. It has been inspiring and heartwarming to take the lead on this committee and have them on at my side. They have truly been a force of nature. Jane, Barbara and Susan have also been standing alongside to offer support and assist as needed. For all of this, I am so very thankful.

At their April 13, 2016, meeting the Board approved a proposal to have DC Web Designers (a Maryland based company) build a new website. A working team was formed, and DC Web Designers worked hand in hand with us to present our content in a user-friendly manner; the site is optimized for viewing on mobile platforms and easy to navigate. We received training by webinar on August 16, and the newly redesigned NTCA web page went "live". Since then, we have been adding pages, content and photos. The website is a work in progress we will be adding much more, including "new" historical documents, and updating events and news regularly. Amanda Kozora Website/Internet Liaison Registry Integrity (RIC) Committee Report

The good news is there is nothing new to report in terms of finding more mixed breed dogs in the registry. I am hopeful that our work has sent a message (to those that have bred mixes, or purebred Cairn, and registered them as Norwich) that we are watching. AKC Norwich have not appeared in any of the auctions since December 2013. I am confident that our work has had an impact.

RIC does have an agenda that I reported in past Club reports, and that includes making changes to AKC procedures to prevent any new mixes or Cairns from entering the registry. Another goal is to get AKC to remove the dogs from the Stud Book that have already been removed from the Registry. However, it will take a great deal to get AKC to make changes, and timing needs to be just right. Perhaps if another removal presents itself. If anyone can brainstorm and come up with ideas to encourage AKC to make changes, please let me know.

We do have some requests of NTCA Members. Please be on the lookout for any advertisements or websites that are not from NTCA Club members that include AKC Norwich. Forward any links to me. In the past, member Betty Bossio sent us a link to a website that resulted in a large AKC registry removal. Just be aware and don't hesitate to pass things on.

Another factor for members to be aware of is not all Norwich mixes look like mixes. Some of them look like nice quality Norwich. I recall one commercial breeder had a very handsome black and tan stud dog. He was highly touted on her website showing many photos of him. It turns out, his sire was Lto Rage, a dog that was 50% Norwich and 50% Cairn, but looked 100% Cairn. (We know because we did the Mars DNA test on him.) One of this dog's puppies, a darling black and tan bitch, was sold to a woman who was very proud of this girl and planned on breeding her. I can't recall how she came to our attention, but I remember Joan Eckert warned her that the bitch was not a purebred. Fortunately, both these dogs came out with the Rage removal. My point is that it isn't always obvious when a Norwich is mixed.

Finally, if someone you don't know wants to purchase a puppy from you, please check with RIC. We are aware of the many commercial breeders out there. Some of them have been able to purchase Norwich from NTCA members. It is wise to do some checking prior to selling a puppy or dog. Once they are out of your hands, you have no control.
