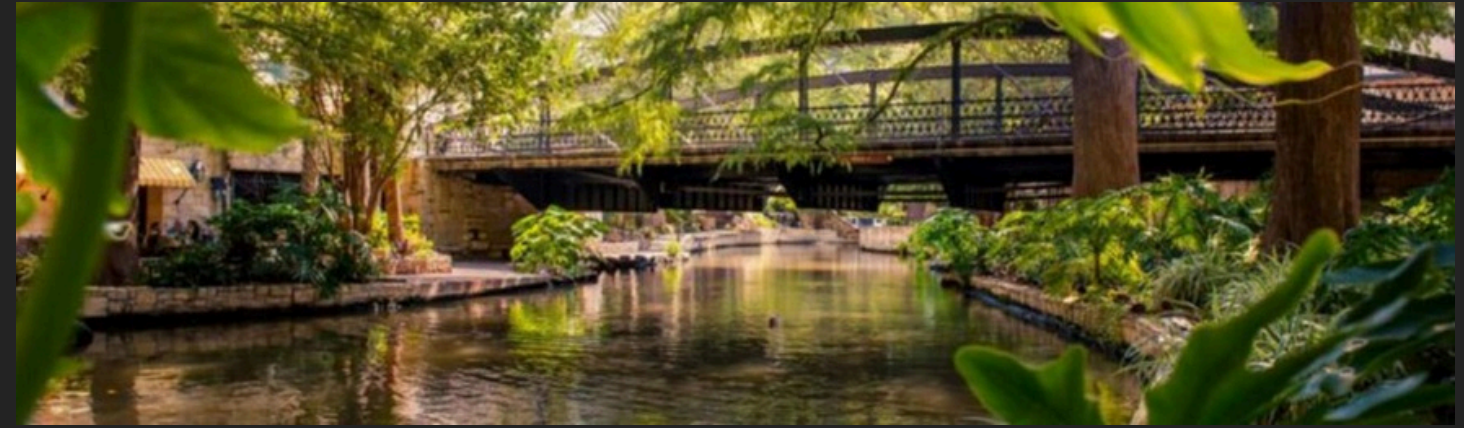

San Antonio's River Walk is a picturesque urban oasis that winds its way through the heart of the city, offering a unique blend of history, culture, and outdoor beauty.



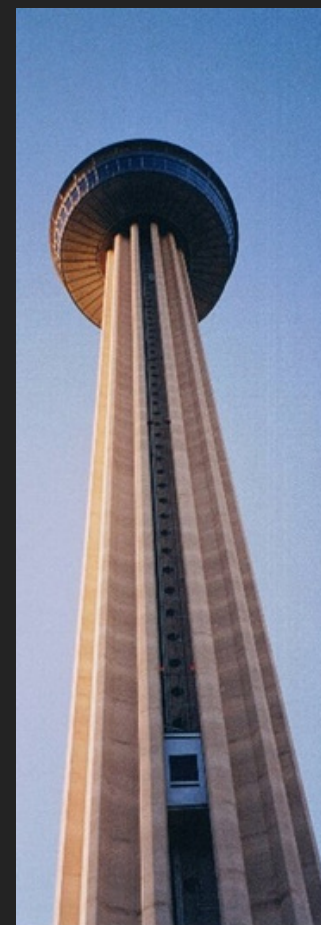
San Antonio River Cruises : Boat Rides & Dinner Cruises

San Antonio Museum of Art

The San Antonio Museum of Art is brimming with masterful pieces. Do not neglect the opportunities to view this extensive gathering of art during your endeavors in the area.

Situated right on the River Walk, the San Antonio Museum of Art has been honored with a special place in the heart of downtown for decades now. This 19th-century brewery building houses more than 30,000 distinct artifacts from more than 5,000 years of human history.



Witte Museum

Explore San Antonio's nature, science & culture with an entry ticket to the Witte Museum Museum. This immersive learning experience includes a dinosaur gallery, Texas heritage center, art gallery, and more.



San Antonio Botanical Garden

The San Antonio Botanical Garden serves as a 38-acre living museum of plants, tranquil escape, living classroom, research and conservation facility, and entertainment venue where art and cultural experiences come to life. Japanese Tea Garden

Originally a rock quarry, in 1915 Ray Lambert, City Parks Commissioner, thought it would make a nice location for a lily pond. Ultimately, it grew to become a tea garden. The latest renovations began in 2007 and cost about \$1.6 million, compared with the \$7,000 Lambert originally spent to open the park. It is a Registered Texas Historic Landmark and on the National Register of Historic Places.
